The language of lament

Unlike nonbelievers, Christians can grieve with hope (see 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18). On Memorial Day and at Christian funerals and burials, our lament is real — and it's a uniquely Christian concept, according to Pastor Mark Vroegop. "It takes faith to pray when you are in pain," he writes in *Dark Clouds, Deep Mercy*. "Belief in God creates challenging questions, and lament provides the opportunity to reorient your hurting heart toward what is true. But in order for that to happen, you have to turn to prayer. The silent treatment must end."

Vroegop, who had a stillborn daughter, says lament opens a door that leads to trust. Heartfelt lament, he says, can be brief or messy and can feel forced or uncomfortable. But the important thing is to "keep talking to God."

"Don't allow your fear, your despair or your track record of silence to cut off the flow of grace," he urges. "Your pain can be a path toward God if you'll allow lament to be your new language."

Open hands

Liturgical scholar Balthasar Fischer (1912-2001) shared an "a-ha" realization about the significance of praying with open, outstretched hands, an ancient practice. The opposite gesture, a closed fist, is used to threaten others or even inflict violence. We also grasp things in closed fists, refusing to let go, to share, to hold gently or loosely.

When we pray with open hands, Fischer explained, we're saying before God that we renounce "all highhandedness, all pride in [our] own sufficiency, all violence." We hold up our empty hands to God, saying, "I have nothing that I have not received from you, nothing that you have not placed in my empty hands. Therefore I do not keep a frantic hold on anything you have given me; therefore, too, I desire not to strike and hurt but only to give and to spread happiness and joy."

Sheely-Hicks Endowed Scholarship

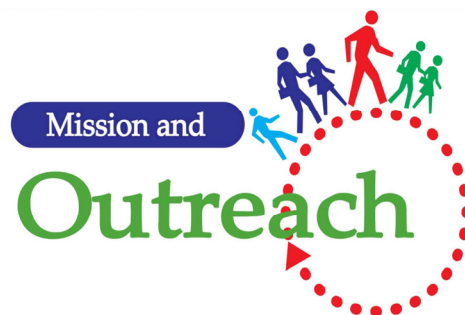
The Sheely-Hicks Endowed Scholarship is for young adults who are affiliated with Trinity UCC in Hanover, PA. Some restrictions apply. The restrictions are as follows:

- *The scholarship is to be used in the following disciplines: music, languages, nursing, religion, Christian education, philosophy, economics and related majors, and political science.
- *The scholarship is to be granted to Trinity affiliated young adults for attendance at accredited liberal arts and science undergraduate colleges or theology schools.
- *The applicant must demonstrate financial need (FAFSA).
- *The applicant must hold a high school or prep school rank in the upper 1/3 of the class and maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5.

Highlights from April Mission & Outreach Meeting

- Food drive for *God's Meal Barrel* was successful and they were very appreciative of Trinity's donation.
- Discussion took place on the neighborhood meal scheduled for May 15. Paper products and plastic utensils will be used since our dishwasher is out of commission.
- Hygiene kits for *Church World Service* were assembled after worship on April 7.
- Discussed a possible upcoming project: Jared Boxes. This project is geared toward children hospitalized at UPMC Hanover. More info forthcoming.
- Discussion on helping youth transition from Hoffman Homes to the outside world by providing duffle bags to carry their possessions in. Project is underway.

- The team looked at how we support *Roots for Boots*. We are researching the feasibility of having a food provider supply us with the on-site luncheon that Trinity sponsors. More info on that later.
