MLK On What Really Matters

Exactly two months before his assassination, Martin Luther King Jr. preached his final sermon at Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta. On February 4, 1968, the civil-rights icon spoke about how he wanted to be remembered at his funeral.

He preferred that people recall not his education or achievements but that he "tried to give his life serving others" and "tried to love somebody."

Adapting a 1952 homily by J. Wallace Hamilton, King decried the "drum major instinct — a desire to be out front, a desire to lead the parade." Humans often want to be great and first, as evidenced by the disciples James and John requesting prime seats in paradise. But King urged listeners to focus on the "reordered priorities" of Jesus, who wants us to "be first in love."

As Jesus showed, "everybody can serve," King said. Your background or status doesn't matter, as long as you have "a heart full of grace" and "a soul generated by love."

May God bless us all with a sense of divine direction in 2025.

Highlights from December Mission & Outreach Meeting

- A movie night is being finalized for January 17, 6:30 p.m. using the new TV system in Fellowship Hall.
- Will have a Neighborhood Supper, Wednesday, February 12, at 6 p.m.
- A total of \$2,000 of hurricane relief money was sent to the UCC Relief Effort. This money was raised by congregational giving, "the jar" and M&O budget line donation.
- M&O will sponsor four more gift tags for Hoffman Homes.
- Long-sleeved TUCC t-shirts will be available for sale—monies benefiting M&O.
- Presented Luke Ostendorf-Snell with a \$500 check to support his airfare for his upcoming trip to Honduras for 1000 Schools Project.
- Presented Vic and Lorene Crooks with a check for \$800 to support their effort "Jacob's Army" which benefits patients at the Hershey Medical Center.
- M&O will assemble 100 hygiene kits for Church World Service. This project begins in January.
- Discussed the possibility of helping the workers of Sign of the Horse who have been left jobless by a fire.
- Planning on another Jared Box project for June, 2025. This project aids children in the Hanover UPMC Hospital Pediatric Unit.
- Discussed the purchase of twin sheets/blankets for the HACC Shelter. This project is currently being researched.
- A mission statement has been compiled and presented for the updated policy manual.
