"When you do nothing, you feel overwhelmed and powerless," observed Connecticut politician Pauline Keezer. "But when you get involved, you feel the sense of hope and accomplishment that comes from knowing you are working to make things better." But as Jesus said, "Whoever loses their life for my sake will find it" (Matthew 10:39, NIV). The hurricanes that battered the East Coast in fall 2024 also battered my soul. I was over the rain and humidity. I was tired of lugging my two preschoolers through the downpours and driving through flash floods at night. Yet I had no reason to complain. Our house was still standing, with no damage. The news around us was worrying and heartbreaking. "What if that was us?" I wondered. "Would I be strong enough?" Then the kids asked to play outside. Even though I knew they'd get wet and muddy, I gave in. When a rainbow appeared, I'd never been more humbled as I remembered: I don't need to be anxious. I don't need to be strong enough. God watches over us all. He knows the hurt and sorrow. And he promises to be "our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble" (Psalm 46:1, ESV). Lord, forgive my unbelief. "Hear my cry, O God ... when my heart is faint. Lead me to the rock that is higher than I" (Psalm 61:1-2, ESV).

The month of February is a big month for me and our youngest son Matthew. We both share a birthday and the whole family gets to celebrate Valentines Day as a day of love for family and friends. In his elementary school the practice of exchanging Valentines Day cards among peers now includes the whole class if you choose to participate. I like this idea, recalling the discomfort of receiving very few valentines in some of those early elementary years. My feeling as a child had always been that everyone should feel loved. My Sunday School teachers taught us that, but my public-school peers didn't get that lesson. So, I am happy to see extra kindness and love being encouraged on a day that can be full of anxiety or disappointment for many children. As an adult and Christian Pastor, I can't emphasize enough: "Everyone should feel loved." This is God's plan for humanity that was expressed in God's gift of Jesus Christ as found in John 3:16-17. Jesus told us to *'love one another as I have loved you'* (John 13:34). Another teaching comes directly from Jesus about loving enemies as well as praying for them in Matthew 5:43 listed above.

These passages pointedly refer to the gift of love given by God and Jesus that we are to share and offer to one another. The Apostle Paul even declared to the early church that the most important gift we give is love. (1 Corinthians 13:13).

Pondering these actions in light of Valentine's Day is easy. We can be more loving toward everyone on Valentines Day. Perhaps even beyond the holiday? Maybe giving love at birthdays is just as easy. We give cards, gifts, and cake on birthdays. Certainly, these are gifts of love and likely appreciated by the receiver. But this is the 'year of giving', not receiving. So, what can we give to others on our birthdays? How about extra love, compassion, and understanding to those around us in gratitude for God's love for us and in us? It seems like a sound plan to me.

As for me, I decided to try the above and make a special gift to the Toy Workshop so more young children can feel 'the love of God and others' at Christmastime. May we each find ways of showing gratitude to God by enlarging the concept of giving with thankful hearts.

A Call to Confirmation

A brief informational meeting was held on Sunday, February 16 after the service in the Sanctuary. We are excited to announce that multiple students committed to start a Confirmation Class this March. The retreat style gatherings will take place once a month beginning on Saturday March 22nd from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at Trinity Church. Additional gatherings are tentatively scheduled for: April 19th, May 17th, June 28th and are open to ages 11+. Students are allowed an absence with make-up assignment. The content of the program will include basics on the Bible, The Life and Ministry of Jesus and how he is our Savior, Christian history/tradition, worship and discipleship/service in our time. The learning format will include: some general reading and research; videos and movies, games and challenges. A simple breakfast and lunch will be provided. A Special Confirmation Sunday will be scheduled after the conclusion of the program. Students will also perform some type of service to the congregation and create a simple mission project to implement during the Confirmation Season, with the help of the pastor.

More information will be announced at a later date.




