Greetings to All in the name of Christ,

The followers of Jesus were very worried when Jesus announced he would be leaving them. He promised not to leave them orphaned and gave the words above to help them understand that both God the Father and Jesus himself would come and make a home in the hearts of every disciple who followed Jesus' word and teachings. This is the very essence of the Holy Spirit that is of God and Christ. It establishes a home in our hearts at baptism and looks to expand that home as we follow Christ across our lives. It is a wonderful testament affirmed by the many faithful church pillars I have known, who said that the more they worship, pray, read, meditate, perform actions of charity, love, mercy and forgiveness, the closer they have felt to God. Perhaps it is because that tiny home established in our hearts at baptism has grown to become the mansion of many rooms so that the holy has a flourishing presence in their body and spirit.

This is something that most people of faith truly want. We want that kind of personal relationship with the holy that it is palpably felt, guiding us when we need help, and giving us the peace and love that re-centers us into the kind of life experience truly worth living. The monastics and ascetics who set themselves aside from the rat race of non-secular life found this great joy when they moved into special communities that focused on faith as a primary essence of life.

While most folks cannot join a monastic movement or move to the caves in Qumran like the desert fathers, we can still make quite a bit more effort to give space and time for God in our hearts and daily lives. This month's article on giving for our "Year of Giving" centers on doing just that: Giving more time and space for the holy in our lives. It can start slowly with a morning prayer asking for the Spirit's guidance across the day. Then add an evening prayer before bed-time, giving thanks for every blessing of the day. Then one could add in a few simple words of gratitude for their meals before eating, known as mealtime grace. When there is extra time, before turning on the television or grabbing the smart phone for entertainment, one might even add in a reading from a devotional and just meditate a few minutes before moving on to that television show. When out and about one might give extra time to a friend you run into, or a moment to a wordy fellow customer at the store who seems to need to talk. You may just be helping to better their day just by a few minutes of listening. I am sure you can come up with many more examples of giving your time for God or Christly things and hope you might do that as an exercise in giving a few extra minutes of time to discern the measure of God's presence in your life. Lastly, we hope you will

dedicate time for the worship of God with us at Trinity, helping to continue the growth of this family of faith in body and spirit.

The life of guidance, peace, love and contentment is just waiting for us to take ahold. So, let us be giving of our time to the holiness, spiritual practices, and missional activities. We may find that our hearts begin to grow in ways that demonstrate the Holy Ones have come and made that home in us.


