### **Holy Interruptions**

Most of us are pretty good at planning—schedules, to-do lists, calendars filled to the brim. But what happens when God steps in with an unexpected detour?

Throughout Scripture, God often moved in the interruptions.

Moses was tending sheep when he saw a burning bush. Mary was simply living her life when an angel appeared. Even Jesus was frequently "interrupted" by people seeking healing or hope—and He never turned them away.

"Interruptible faith" is a posture of openness. It's saying, "Lord, here's my plan—but I trust Yours more." It means slowing down, paying attention, and being willing to let God rearrange our day for His greater purpose.

Proverbs 16:9 (NIV) reminds us, "In their hearts humans plan their course, but the Lord establishes their steps." May we have the courage to let Him.

Have you ever paused to listen — really listen — to the world around you? "Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises!" (Psalm 98:4, ESV)

#### 2025 A Season of Giving to God and Others

"Obedience to Christ as a form of Giving to God and Others" "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." John 14:15 NRSVue

#### Dear Friends,

As we enter the fall season of faith, we continue in dialogue about a 'year of giving' by focusing upon obedience to Christ. I believe that obedience to Christ's commands is a form of giving to God. By being obedient to Christ's teachings and commands we automatically structure our life and daily actions around God's plan for humanity rather than our own. Our time becomes 'time given to God' as we look toward what Christ would have us to do in any particular situation. For example: When preparing to leave the house, a friend calls and needs to talk over a problem or crisis you may have wisdom about. Staying on the phone means getting behind on your schedule for the day, but taking the call means helping someone in need. Christ would tell his disciples to help others first and then go on with the daily schedule. Choosing that path honors Christ's teachings and is a giving of your time to God and to others, in this case the friend in need. Jesus gives, all who follow him, the ways of life that we are intended to live. He teaches, preaches, and demonstrates all of these lessons in the gospels and then bids us to follow. He also lets us know that if we truly love him and God, we will keep his commandments. So following his teachings and examples in our daily process of living is how we show love for God and Christ. We give of ourselves. We give of our time. We give of our energy and material goods. All as a gift to God, and summarily...a gift to others.

The apostle Paul would even go so far as to say obedience to God in Christ is our worship. His letter to the Romans reads: "I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, on the basis of God's mercy, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your reasonable act of worship. Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of the mind, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:1-2 NRSVue)

Living in obedience to Christ is the ultimate form of giving because it not only includes the giving of ourselves to God through time, energy, focus and sacrifice, but ultimately includes others around us. Many times, it is those in some sort of need around us who benefit from our faithfulness to Christ and the actions we perform on Christ's behalf. Through giving obedience to Christ, we fulfil the great command: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and your neighbor as yourself." (Luke 10:27 NRSVue)
